

Looking Back—Cedarville Players

Following a very successful Minstrel Show in the summer of 1948, which included a production of Indian and Early Settler Activities, a party was held in the Cedarville Community House for the Minstrel Cast. It was at this party that it was decided that the cast would like to organize a group to perform a series of plays for the benefit of the community.


The Cedarville Players were established on Oct 2nd, 1948 with a roster of 50 members. Members of this group would either have roles on stage or would play equally important roles in the production and support staff. An election was held resulting in its first officer roster of, Kay Frank, President, Laurel Hutchison, Vice President, Arlene Erickson, Treasurer and Lorraine Fry, Secretary.

It was decided that the first play would be a farce to be performed on October 14th and 15th titled Bolts and Nuts. Kay Frank was slated as the director of this first production. 


