2015 Children's Book Awards Ceremony at Cedarville Museum

Winners of the 2015 Jane Addams Children's Book awards were announced Saturday, May 2, at the Cedarville Museum.

The honors, which carry a cash award and certificate, were first given in 1953 by the Jane Addams Peace Association to recognize outstanding children's books that promote peace, social justice, world community and the equality of the sexes and all races. JAPA is affiliated with the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, first headed by Jane Addams

The several awards were announced by Beth McGowan, Rockford, a member of the national committee that chose the winning titles.

As part of the program, Cedarville's Paul Fry, an authority on Addams, answered questions from the attendees about the 1935 Nobel Peace Prize recipient.

Special mention was made of the Rockford Public School 205 Montessori program for its use of nominated books as classroom teaching tools and its inclusion of diverse groups in the selection process.

Nominated books were provided to teachers through funds from PTOs and a grant from the Community Fund of Northern Illinois.




